





A new local scholarship available for the first year to graduating seniors from EPS is the Wayne and Dorothy Currie Family Scholarship.

Dorothy Kinney Currie was raised in rural Elgin and attended Park Center School and Elgin Public High School. After getting her teaching certification from Wayne State College, she taught at rural and Elgin schools throughout her teaching career while living on the family farm west of Elgin with Wayne Currie. Dorothy and Wayne valued the rewards of a great education and vowed that their four children would obtain a four-year college education, in which they all did. This scholarship is to reward academic excellence and the proven determination to achieve great accomplishments in all aspects of life. This scholarship is to reward an Elgin graduate for such accomplishments and who exhibits high potential going forward.


All Kindergarten students must be 5 years old by July 31st and have all current immunizations. We are required by state law to have a copy of your child's official birth certificate and immunizations on file.




Administratively Speaking . . .

Later this spring we will be sending some of our students on a trip to Omaha, which will take the place of the trip to the east coast for this year due to Covid issues of traveling. As a school we will be updating our facilities this summer and finishing some other projects as well. The Peptomist was first printed in 1923 and is complete with photos, stories, and a complete listing of alumni dating back to 1897. Many of the business advertisements are familiar to Elgin natives. Statewide Assessment (NSCAS) Nebraska Student Centered Assessment System

The statewide assessment (NSCAS) is in early April! The assessments will take place in Reading and Math this year for grades 3rd-8th with additional assessments in Science in the 5th and 8th grades.

The NSCAS test serves many purposes for the school and the Nebraska Department of Education. As a staff, we want to make sure students are prepared and comfortable with the test so their focus is on answering the questions. Here are a few of the things the teachers have been doing to ensure a positive test taking experience:

taking practice assessments reviewing content and skills talking about the assessments trying to excite students about the upcoming assessments!

As parents, there are a few things you can do that will help your student succeed: sleep for 8 hours the night before eat a protein as part of breakfast talk to them about the assessments encourage students to spend as much time as they need stay positive about the assessments!
