CLASS SCHEDULES

First Day of Classes - Thursday, August 15, 2013 School will start at 8:15 a.m. and dismiss at 1 p.m. the first day for all students K-12. Morning Preschool will be held 8:15 - 11:30 for the first day of classes. Afternoon Preschool will begin on Monday Aug. 19th.

Regular schedule will be observed starting Friday, August 16 with school hours: 8:15 a.m. to 3:43 p.m. for high school (7-12) and 8:15 a.m. to 3:40 p.m. for K-6.

Morning Preschool (4 year olds) will be held each weekday 8:15 a.m. -11:30 a.m. Afternoon Preschool (3 year olds) will be held Monday thru Thursday 1:00 - 3:40 p.m.

Breakfast and lunch will be served starting August 15.

Please pay in advance for food services.

In an effort to cut postage costs, your student will be given a statement when your family lunch account is getting low. If you furnish your email address to us, the information can be e-mailed to you. Your account balance can also be checked on our website with the proper login and password. Please pay promptly.

SCHOOL & SPORTS PHYSICALS



All 7th grade students and Kindergarteners are required to obtain a physical and submit a copy to be kept on file at the school.

All students in grades 7-12 participating in any sport must have a health physical dated after May 1st of the current year before he/she can start

practices. Forms for these physicals are available in the main office during normal business hours.

IMMUNIZATIONS

Has your child received any immunizations over the summer? Please bring us an updated immunization record to be kept on file.

Applications for Kids Connection, the Nebraska Children's Health Insurance Program, and student accident insurance administered by Student Assurance Services, Inc., are available in the main office of the school.

EMERGENCY CONTACT INFORMATION

Emergency Contact Information and the Child

Health Information forms need to be completed at the beginning of the school year. They are a very valuable part of your child's school records. When your child is sick or injured, you will be so happy



that the information in our computer system is accurate. If you change jobs, phone numbers, or contact persons, etc. please contact the school immediately with your new information.

ALERTNOW CONTACT SYSTEM

During inclement weather, we have implemented the use of a phone/e-mail messaging service. Contact information you supply will be used to alert all students/parents in the event of an early dismissal, late start, or cancellation. The system will also be used to broadcast reminders of important events

E-MAIL ADDRESS

It is highly recommended that you include your e-mail addresses on your child's student information form. This will allow for more efficient communication between parents and educators.

ATTACK ON ASTHMA

State regulation requires that our school and early childhood education program be prepared to implement an emergency treatment plan, called a protocol, anytime a student or staff member experiences a <u>life threatening</u> asthma attack or systemic allergic reaction (anaphylaxis).

If you know that your student has asthma or a known allergy, it is *critically important* that you communicate this information to our school staff. You may contact the main office with this information. For each student with a known allergic condition or asthma, you must provide the school with (1) written medical documentation, (2) instructions, and (3) medications as directed by a physician. In the event that your student experiences a life threatening asthma attack or



experiences a life threatening asthma attack or systemic allergic reaction, we will defer to the specific documents and medication that you have provided. If you do not have medical documentation and instructions on file with the school for your student, we will defer to the regulatory protocol.

If, for whatever reason, you do not want your student to receive the life-saving emergency treatment under the protocol, you must file your written objection with the school.

voice mail for the teacher and the teacher can return your call at their earliest convenience. This voice mail system will cause less interruption from instruction time and still allow efficient communication with teachers.

SCHOOLMASTER PASS



Elgin Public School is pleased to offer you instant access to your child's school information with the implementation of Parental Access Support System (PASS). This system will give you the opportunity to log on to the

school website and you will be able to view information that will keep you informed of your child's school status.

Attendance, grades, behavior log, and weekly progress are accessible through the PASS system. This information is protected by a PIN number that will be sent home during the 1st week of school along with an instruction sheet. If you have questions or difficulties with the system, please call the school.

My Child Is Absent--Does the School Need a Note?

It is very important that the school knows the whereabouts of all the students during the school day. Parents should call the school (843-2455) right away in the morning to tell us that your child is sick or has an appointment, or you can leave a message on the school answering machine. We should still receive a handwritten note from the parent when the child returns to school. All notes are filed in the student's file for the entire year. If there is ever a question about an absence that is reported on Schoolmaster, we have that note to verify the information.



Emergency Calls Only

Things always "come up" that sometimes need a change of plans for your child but the daily "Ride the bus", "Don't ride the bus", or "Walk to Grandma's" plans are not phone messages that we should need to daily interrupt classroom work for.

We are happy to help WHEN NEEDED but please try to plan ahead. Send a note with your child or email the teacher in the morning if your child should do something different after school other than their normal routine. Calls to the school office for these things should be rare and of an emergency nature -- though we're all aware there are exceptions. For information, questions, or concerns, please call anytime.

CONCUSSION AWARENESS

The Nebraska Concussion Awareness Act passed during the 2011 regular session of the Nebraska Legislature. The law is intended as a safety measure: to focus greater attention, understanding and responsiveness on one of the most common injuries experienced by children and adolescents who participate in athletic activities and to minimize the risk of catastrophic injury or death that might occur from a concussion that is not properly evaluated and managed.


The "milk jug" caps saving program is coming to an end.
