SCHOOL & SPORTS PHYSICALS



All 7th grade students and Kindergarteners are required to obtain a physical and submit a copy to be kept on file at the school.

All students in grades 7-12 participating in any sport must have a health physical dated after

May 1st of the current year before he/she can start practices. Forms for these physicals are available on our website and in the main office during normal business hours. All students must also take impact testing for concussions.


Concussion Awareness

The Nebraska Concussion Awareness Act passed during the 2011 regular session of the Nebraska Legislature. The law is intended as a safety measure: to focus greater attention, understanding and responsiveness on one of the most common injuries experienced by children and adolescents who participate in athletic activities and to minimize the risk of catastrophic injury or death that might occur from a concussion that is not properly evaluated and managed.

JMC —— STUDENT INFORMATION SYSTEM

Elgin Public Schools uses JMC as our Student Information System. This system is a webbased system that is very user friendly for Staff, Students, and Parents. If you already have your username and password from last



year, you can log in to make changes now. If you don't know your password, click "forgot password" and change your password. Each parent can determine which phone numbers receive text alerts or voice recordings. Emails can also be sent directly from the JMC system.

EMERGENCY CONTACT INFORMATION

Emergency Contact Information and the Child Health Information need to be completed at the beginning of the school year. They are a very valuable part of your child's school records. When your child is sick or injured, you will be so happy that the information in our computer system is accurate. With our new JMC system if you change jobs, phone numbers, or contact persons, etc. you will be able to submit changes via the JMC Parent website.

JMC MESSAGING SYSTEM

During inclement weather, we will be utilizing the JMC phone/e-mail messaging service. Contact information you supply will be used to alert all students/parents in the event of an unplanned early dismissal, late start, or cancellation. The system will also be used to broadcast reminders of important events

E-MAIL ADDRESS

It is highly recommended that you include your e-mail addresses on your child's student information form. This will allow for more efficient communication between parents and educators.

SCHOOL SAFETY

Some of the notable things to be aware of are that all pick-ups and drop offs of elementary students will be on the north side of the preschool building. If those pick-ups/drop-offs occur after school has started or before it ends, they will need to be done at the main office. The main office will be the only location where people will enter or leave the school after school hours have begun. That location will also be a safety location as you will have to be "buzzed in"

to enter the office (main school building) and thus have access to the other buildings on the block.

To access anywhere on campus, the outside public will need to start at the main office.

Any person not attending the Elgin Public Schools as a student or not employed by the district will need to go to the main office to gain any access. The safety plans will have VERY LITTLE effect on the students and their school day. Great pains have been taken to make that the case. It will, however, take some adjustment by the public and patrons, though we all know you are in favor of making our school a safer place for everyone.



My Child Is Absent-Does the School Need a Note?

It is very important that the school knows the whereabouts of all the students during the school day. Parents should call the school (843-2455) right away in the morning to tell us that your child is sick or has an appointment, or you can leave a message on the school answering machine. We should still receive a handwritten note from the parent when the child returns to school. All notes are filed in the student's file for the entire year. If there is ever a question about an absence that is reported on JMC we have that note to verify the information.



Emergency Calls Only

Things always "come up" that sometimes need a change of plans for your child but the daily "Ride the bus", "Don't ride the bus", or "Walk to Grandma's" plans are not phone messages that we

should need to daily interrupt classroom work for.

We are happy to help WHEN NEEDED but please try to plan ahead. Send a note with your child or email the teacher in the morning if your child should do something different after school other than their normal routine. Calls to the school office for these things should be rare and of an emergency nature -- though we're all aware there are exceptions. For information, questions, or concerns, please call anytime.

ATTACK ON ASTHMA


State regulation requires that our school and early childhood education program be prepared to implement an emergency treatment plan, called a protocol, anytime a student or staff member experiences a <u>life threatening</u> asthma attack or systemic allergic reaction (anaphylaxis).

If you know that your student has asthma or a known allergy, it is critically important that you communicate this information to our school staff. You may contact the main office with this information. For each student with a known allergic condition or asthma, you must provide the school with (1) written medical documentation, (2) instructions, and (3) medications as directed by a physician. In the event that your student experiences a life threatening asthma attack or systemic allergic reaction, we will defer to the specific documents and medication that you have provided. If you do not have medical documentation and instructions on file with the school for your student, we will defer to the regulatory protocol.

If, for whatever reason, you do not want your student to receive the life-saving emergency treatment under the protocol, you must file your written objection with the school.

If you have questions or concerns about the protocol or your student's health issues, please contact our school nurse, or Mike Brockhaus, Supt. at 843-2455.
