FFA News

January 10th marks the date of District X FFA Leadership Development Events. This year the district contest will be held in Atkinson. 20 members will be competing in various speech related events: Sr. Public Speaking, Jr. Public Speaking, Cooperative Speaking, Natural Resource Speaking, Creed Speaking, Jr. Parliamentary Procedure (Now called Chapter Code of Conduct), Job Interviews and Agricultural Demonstrations. District X is made up of 14 schools in the area and only the top two members/teams will advance to the state level. Everyone has one shot in very competitive events to do their very best to move to the next level.

Members will be giving speeches related to agriculture in some way. Marie Meis' speech is on crop commodity boards while Allyson Wemhoff will be talking about GMO's. Meanwhile one of the agricultural demonstration teams will be showing judges how to determine soil texture and use moisture sensing probes to help produces manage their irrigation usage throughout the growing season. The other team will demonstrate how to properly give an adult canine (yes using a real a dog) a vaccine. They will show the judges how to determine the correct dosage, fill a syringe, restrain the animal and give the shot. To follow up they have an App that allows pet owners to keep track of their animals' vaccines. Good luck to all members competing on January 20th!

What to expect after you submit your FAFSA

The FAFSA opened October 1 so many of you have already completed and submitted your form. Here's what happens next: Expect a Student Aid Report (SAR). You'll receive it via an email link if you provided an email address on your FAFSA. The SAR acknowledges that your FAFSA was received, and if you need to take further action to process your FAFSA. Make sure you applied for admission to colleges you listed on your FAFSA. Colleges who receive your FAFSA results typically won't send you a financial aid package until you've applied and have been accepted to the school. Watch for verification requests. The college(s) you listed on your FAFSA might request verification of your FAFSA information. If so, send the required documents to the colleges' financial aid office. Watch for financial aid award notifications. The colleges you applied to – and listed on your FAFSA – will send you a financial aid award notification detailing the types and amounts of aid they're offering based on your financial need.

Haven't completed your FAFSA yet? No problem! You and a parent can complete the form at FAFSA.gov. Before you start, create an FSA ID for you and one for a parent at <u>fsaid.ed.gov</u>. You'll need them to access and sign the FAFSA. For free help with the FAFSA, watch this FAFSA Demo, use at <u>educationquest.org</u> or call and schedule appointment with Mrs. Rittscher.

Reminder: Application for Susan Buffet Scholarship is due February 1, 2018. Time is running out! If you haven't completed FAFSA, get that taken care ASAP. It can take 7-10 days for FAFSA to be processed.
