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
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


The junior high students in Mrs. Rittscher's Careers class hosted a Mock Career Fair, inviting 4th-6th graders and any other interested students.

Several careers were represented at the mock career fair, including careers from most of the career clusters: audiologist, logistician, paralegal, reservation and travel clerk, financial manager in agriculture industry, bomb technician, federal marshall, and many more.

The mock career fair was a culminating project for a semester spent figuring out which career clusters students were most likely to find interesting, most likely to be like minded in regard to values, and most likely to have strengths in. Then, they had to pick careers that they didn't know anything about! After all, how do you know what you want to be if you don't know what a career even is?

After spending time researching and becoming very familiar with that career, students created display materials and prepared scripts to get ready for the mock career fair. 

The elementary Art students will begin the second semester with radial designs better known as snowflakes. We discuss that a radial design radiates out from a center point and has one design that repeats itself. Examples besides snowflakes would be hubcaps and rose windows in churches. Another example of a radial design most people are familiar with are kaleidoscopes. The students will have the experience this year to look through our new kaleidoscopes to see how a radial design works. The K-2 students will create 8" snowflakes. The 3rd and 4th grade students will make 18" ones while the 5th and 6th grades get to create the 36" snowflakes. Be checking out the windows around Elgin to see their work in January.


Get Back into a Normal Routine:

Ideally, it is best to maintain your normal daily routine, even during the break. Unfortunately, for many of us, this isn't often practical as we do have to adjust our routines to accommodate the holidays and the festivities surrounding them.

- o Kids often look to us as an example, whether they admit it or not. So as hard as it may be, getting back into a regular routine where you get up at your normal time and get everyone up, dressed and ready for the day a few days before the break is over will make it much easier to get kids on board and back into their normal school week routine. Having breakfast and lunch at the same time during the day as they would at school or as close to it as possible is also very helpful, especially for younger school aged kids.
- o Enough rest and sleep. It's easy and quite common to change and break the bedtime routine and overall sleep schedule during this time of year. Get back to your kid's normal school day sleep and wake time schedules a few days before they actually return to school.
