## Coffee Strawberry Nutella Cake Ingredients

Butter
Vanilla extract
All purpose flour
Eggs
Sour cream
Light brown sugar
Baking powder
Cinnamon
Corn starch
Salt
Granulated sugar
Nutella
Strawberry syrup

## Preheat oven to 350 degrees

## Step 1: Filling

Add $3 / 4$ cup Light Brown sugar, $1 / 4$ cup of all purpose flour, and 2 Tsp of cinnamon into a a mixing bowl and whisk together. Set aside.
Step 2: Topping
In a separate bowl mix together $2 / 3$ Cup of Light brown sugar, 1 cup of All-purpose flour, 2 tsp of Ground cinnamon, and $1 / 4$ Tsp of salt. Then crumble $1 / 2$ cup of unsalted butter and $1 / 4$ cup of Nutella mix with your hands until the mixture is a sandy texture.

Step 3: Cake
In a big mixing bowl mix $21 / 4$ Cup of all Purpose flour, $1 / 4$ cup of Cornstarch, $21 / 2 \mathrm{tsp}$ of Baking powder, $3 / 4 \mathrm{tsp}$ of Salt, $1 / 2$ cup of Light brown Sugar, and 1 cup of Granulated Sugar. For this part you can use either a hand mixer or a standing mixer. Once fully mixed together and in $3 / 4$ cups of Unsalted butter at room temperature. Continue to mix until no butter can be seen. Add 3 large eggs, 2 tsp of vanilla extract, 1 cup of sour cream, and 2 $3 / 4 \mathrm{tsp}$ of nutella. And mix on medium to high speed.
Step 4: assemble
Grease and flour a 9x9in pan. Put half of the cake batter into the bottom of the pan evenly. Pour the Filling evenly on top of the batter in the pan. Then take the rest of the batter and spread it on top of the filling making sure to cover all the filling evenly. Sprinkle The topping on the top.
Step 5: baking
Oven should be preheated to 350 degrees fahrenheit. Place on the top rack and bake for 50 minutes at 350.
Step 5: Icing
Whisk together 3 cup of Whipped cream and 2 cups of Nutella in a mixing bowl. Then add one tsp of strawberry syrup.
Step 6: finishing
Once the cake is done, let it cool for about 20 minutes. This cake should make 12 pieces. Add the icing on top and drizzle the strawberry flavoring over the icing and cake. Then enjoy it.

Remember the three keys to preventing illness:

1. Teach your child to wash his hands
