



chain for the books they read. They will be rewarded with a movie night. Nice job, elementary!


New High School Math Teacher

The science class competed in a Paper Tower competition the first week of school. The students had to design and build a free standing tower made of only two sheets of computer paper and 30 cm of masking tape.


The winners from each class period were: Physical Science - Josh/Tyler/Adam (83 cm)


